*Rev. Barbara Child began her professional life teaching in the KSU English Department 1963-78. She then turned to practicing poverty law at the Portage County Legal Aid Society; in 1981 she returned to academia, serving as Director of Writing and Research at Golden Gate University School of Law in San Francisco and then as Director of Legal Drafting at University of Florida College of Law. She became a minister in 1996 and retired from full-time Unitarian Universalist ministry in 2010. Her memoir, *Memories of a Vietnam Veteran: What I Have Remembered and What He Could Not Forget*, begins at Kent State University, where she met Alan Morris when he was co-leader of the Kent Vietnam Veterans against the War and she was chair of the Portage County ACLU.*
