People are often interested in statistics about pledging in our congregation. In this chart you can find the dollar range for pledges made to the church during Fiscal Year 2012 along with the total number of pledges given in each range.

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\*This pledge total for Fiscal Year 2012 does not include \$11,765 collected seperately for our dues to the Unitarian Universalist Association and the Ohio Meadville District. We have built our full fair share dues for Fiscal Year 2013 into our budget.

We know that pledging is a very personal decision. We also know that people often ask where they can get more information to help them determine how much they will pledge. The Unitarian Universalist Association has produced a very helpful Suggested Fair Share Giving Guide, which you can find on the last page of this packet. This guide suggests contributing a percentage of income to our annual stewardship campaign, adjusted based upon income levels. guide can help you reflect upon your pledge.

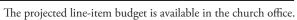

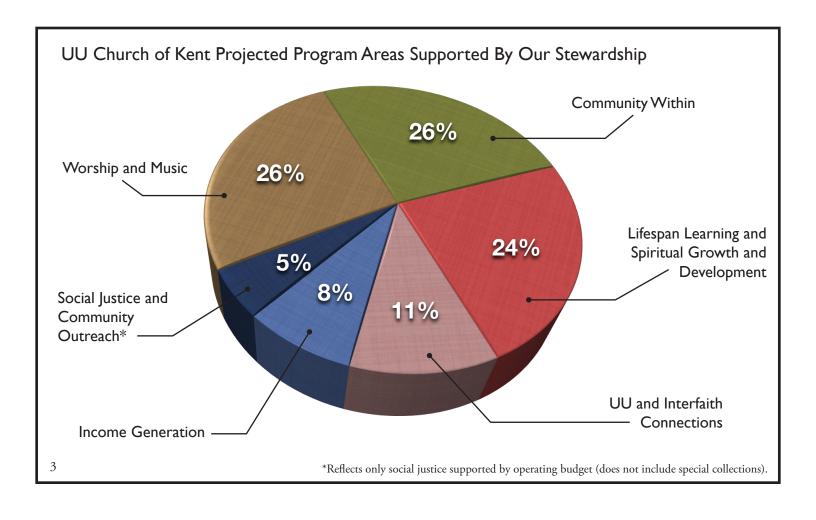
